At a Glance

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Safety and hygiene concept for the International Supply Chain Conference 2021

The International Supply Chain Conference is one of the largest business conferences worldwide for supply chain management and logistics, making it a fixed date in the diary. This is where decision-makers in the logistics industry come together for sharing, discussion and networking. Before the pandemic, it was regularly attended by up to 3,500 people from 40 countries. This year it will be held as a hybrid event. Besides the physically attended part of the conference in Berlin, much of the content will also be transmitted digitally. The focus as ever will be on sharing, knowledge transfer and discussion, in the plenary sessions, in breakout sessions and at the trade exhibition. Networking will be possible, but different than usual with its own specific safety and hygiene concept. Our priority will be to safeguard everyone's health and safety, including during the supporting programme. Our hygiene concept is based on the official regulations and includes experience and findings from other BVL events and from our event partners. It also includes recommendations from our contacts at Berlin State Authorities and from our epidemiology expert and consultant, Prof. Dr. Ralph Brinks from Witten-Herdecke University. It is therefore always in compliance at least with the current official regulations. The concept has to be confirmed by all participants as part of their registration and is being updated all the time. Among others, it includes the following measures (as of 29 September 2021):

There will be an upper limit to the number of attendees. Registrations are considered according to the date they are received, and participation will be facilitated according to the number of people allowed for the duration of the event.

- Access to the conference is only possible with proof of being fully vaccinated or recovered, or with a current test.
- All event rooms are regularly aired, and the air-conditioning in the hotel works with 100% fresh air.
- Food and drinks will be served on a local basis according to the official regulations as amended.
- The supporting trade exhibition will be organised with the necessary spacing between the stands.

The hygiene and safety concept for the conference is being updated all the time, giving particular consideration to the regulations issued by the State of Berlin and the recommendations of our epidemiology consultant.
